Prison and Reentry Education Program May 20, 2020

The Prison and Reentry Education Program addresses the questions of defendants and their families regarding sentencing, surrender, and reentry to the community. Information presented includes:

- security levels within the Bureau of Prisons
- what defendants should and should not bring on their report day
- expectations of inmates and a typical day within the Bureau of Prisons
- halfway house placement and what to expect as your imprisonment ends
- expectations and requirements of supervised release
- on-line resources, including materials from the Bureau of Prisons

A panel including a U.S. Probation Officer, representatives from a halfway house and the Bureau of Prisons, and defendants who have already completed their prison sentence will be available to answer more specific questions.

The program will be presented at the **Minneapolis Federal Courthouse**, 300 South Fourth Street, 5th Floor Conference Room, Minneapolis, MN.

Attendance is voluntary, but <u>registration is required</u> if you plan to attend, as seating is limited. Two family members per defendant (age 16 and older) are welcome to attend.
