BIRTH CERTIFICATE

If record exists in birth location → client to use birth state **Birth Certificate Application:**

- Costs \$26 (fee varies by state)

Name/Date/Info Error on Birth Certificate → Client to use **Birth Record Amendment Application:**

- Costs \$40 to file amendment form + \$26 for new copy
 - You can help by getting supporting docs if client does not have → request certified birth record, marriage/divorce record, school record, etc for client

ID CARD/DRIVER LICENSE

If has required forms → Client can apply for ID/License; schedule online or by phone (651) 284-1000.

Driver License Reinstatement for unpaid traffic fines, child support, etc.

1. Refer client to **Diversion Solutions** (651)385-4341 for fee and application help

 - Client can call 3-4 weeks before release date to start process
2. Child Support License Revocation
 - a. Client should call child support worker/office ASAP to ask for payment plan
 - b. Can use Diversion Solutions program
 - c. Limited 90 day license to drive to work: https://dps.mn.gov/divisions/dvs/forms-documents/Documents/DL_Application_LimitedLicense_ChildSupportSuspension.pdf

Non Emergency Medical Transportation *Public/State Insurance paid taxi rides, bus pass, or mileage reimbursement to appts that health insurance covers (medical, dental, mental health, treatment). Call the member number on health care card to ask about transportation (insurance can be Medical Assistance or MA based plan like BluePlus, Health Partners, Ucare, etc.). Must be scheduled 5 days before appt.*


