

# VOTING WITH A CRIMINAL RECORD

Your criminal record does NOT affect your right to vote in Minnesota unless you are currently serving a felony conviction sentence, including probation or parole.

## ✓VOTING AFTER A FELONY CONVICTION

You can vote after you finish all parts of your sentence, including any probation, parole, or supervised release.

As soon as you finish (once you are 'off-paper'), you can vote. You will need to register to vote. It is best to register before Election Day, but it is not required. **You cannot register to vote until your probation or parole is complete and you are officially discharged from supervision.**

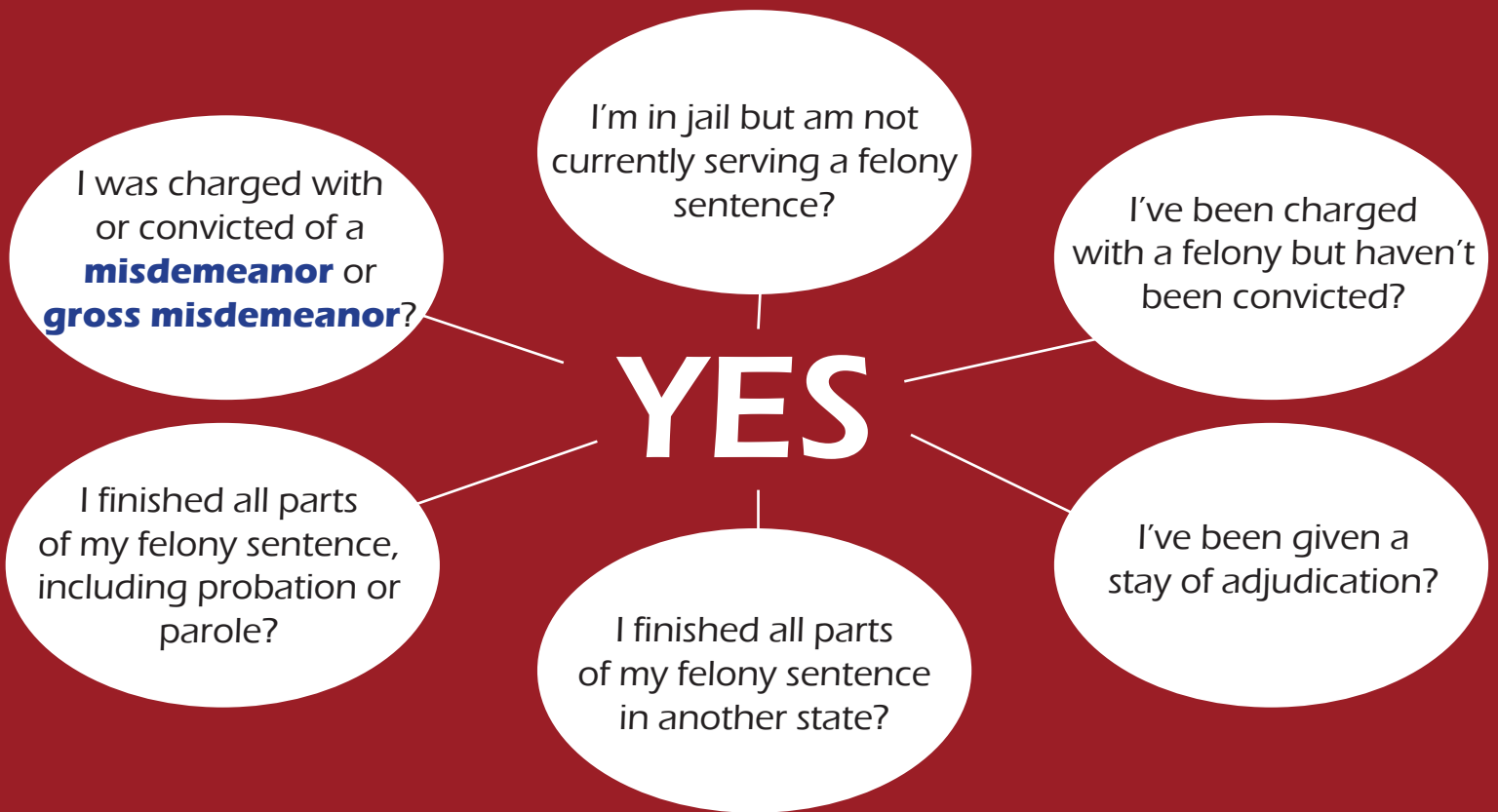
## NOT SURE ABOUT YOUR LEGAL STATUS?
