

IS A GUN WORTH **5-15 YEARS** OF YOUR LIFE?

As a "Mandatory" condition of supervision, the Court shall provide, as an explicit condition of a sentence of probation/supervised release for a felony, misdemeanor, or an infraction, the defendant NOT commit another federal, state, or local crime during their term of probation/supervised release. The Court may provide further conditions of probation/supervised release to include: refrain from possessing a firearm, destructive device, or other dangerous weapons.

FELON IN POSSESSION OF A FIREARM?

IMPRISONMENT UP TO **15 YEARS**

18 U.S.C. §924(a)(8)

Use or Carrying a Firearm During and in Relation to any Crime of Violence or Drug Trafficking offense may be sentenced as follows:

DURING VIOLENT
OR DRUG CRIME?

5 YEARS

BRANDISHED

DISCHARGED

IMPRISONMENT
NOT LESS THAN

10 YEARS

18 U.S.C. §924(c)(1)(A)(iii)

A person who violates section 922(g) of Title 18 and has three previous convictions by any court referred to in section 922(g)(1) of Title 18 for a violent felony or a serious drug offense, or both, committed on occasions different from one another, such person shall be

IMPRISONED FOR NOT LESS THAN **15 YEARS**

18 U.S.C. §924(e)(1)
